

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND CHILDCARE

We support programs and policies designed to address access, quality and equitable funding for early childhood education and childcare.



What's Going on in Ohio?

- Infant care costs on average \$9,687 a year Will Petrik, Budget Researcher for Policy Matters Ohio
- New mail-in and voter identification laws effective, March 17.
- In 2021, National Council of Nonprofits reported nearly one quarter (24%) of 1,000 organizations from all 50 states reported vacancies; while Ohio ranks 38th in unemployment rate among other states.
- Reproductive and gender identification rights ranks Ohio as one of the most restrictive states behind the top first 8 states.
- New "permit-less carry" or "constitutional carry" laws for gun owners effective, June 2021.
- Ohio Association of Food Banks' Hope Lane-Gavin, pushing for state funded SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) for older adults.
- Black women in Ohio are 2.2 times more likely to die from pregnancy-related causes, data shows Ohio Health Policy Institute.



What Must We Do?

What is Advocacy?

- Giving voice on behalf of another.
- Acting in support of a belief or policy.
- The support of recommendation of a policy.

<u>Advocacy is important because:</u>

- Key decision makers react to those credible groups or individuals who most effectively bring their issues to the forefront of the public agenda (or shape the agenda itself).
- Governments have competing interests and concerns (including their own) priorities).
- If you don't engage, someone else will.
- You have the power to affect change around your issues (voters, taxpayers).







Advocacy in Action

- Define the Issue.
- Identify possible solutions.
- Develop engagement plan.

<u>Types of Advocacy:</u>

- Attend a townhall meeting.
- Attend rallies
- Provide public testimony/comments.
- Vote on all levels (local, state & national)
- Listen and take notes on who's speaking on various issues.
- Network.
- Email, call or visit your policymaker.
- Become a member of social issue organization. •

Meeting with Policymakers

- Do your research. Learn more about the policymaker(s), the issue, committee hearings, etc.
- Be prepared. Bring handouts policy agenda and/or plan of action.
- Introduce yourself, your organization, the issue and most importantly, be personable. •
- Be clear and concise about the meeting. Share your points and policy agenda. Use facts and • real-life stories about the issue.
- Be respectful and stick to the issue.
- Say thank you and offer to follow-up.
- Send a thank you note, letter or follow-up information. •
- Engage on social media.
- Invite policymakers to your agencies and organization's events.
- Stand out get creative with t-shirts, relevant props and posters. •
- Your VOICE. You VOTE!
