2+ years of planning by over 100 individuals and 40 organizations

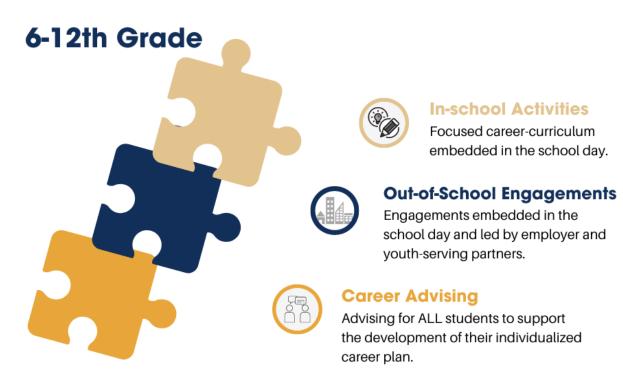


Every student graduates with a career vision and plan, and the confidence, knowledge, education, skills, and networks they need to own their future and contribute to a competitive regional workforce

Launched November 2021 in CMSD

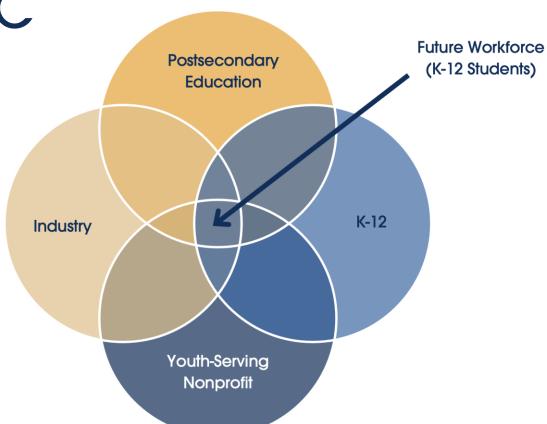


Pillar 2: GCCC

GCCC VISION:

A comprehensive, coordinated, and community-wide approach to career exploration and readiness that empowers young Greater Clevelanders, sets them up for success, and advances regional economic prosperity.





The Relationship/The Difference

PACE = The Work (program-level)

The implementation of **the student experience** which includes the embedded curriculum of in-class activities, out-of-school engagements, and career advising for 6-12th graders.

GCCC = How the Work Gets Done (systems-level)

The **collective of multi-sector partners** aligning resources to create a regional career pathway system to scale PACE across Greater Cleveland (guided by a common agenda, and shared set of metrics).

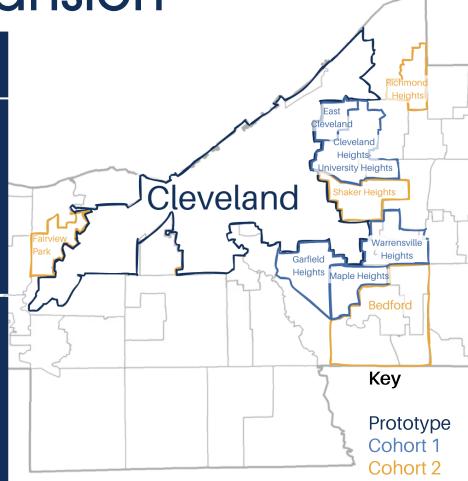
